New Council Meeting Agenda

Section 124 of the *Charter, Constitution and Laws of the Knights of Columbus* requires each subordinate council to hold at least two regular meetings each month. One is a Council meeting for all members. The purpose of this meeting is to build fraternal spirit, to share information, to strengthen formation in the faith, and to present matters that require the vote of council members.

The other monthly meeting is an Officers' Planning meeting. The purpose of this meeting is to plan programs, develop budgets, pay approved bills, prepare motions, discuss new ideas, and deal with other necessary matters. Council officers, directors, and chairpersons are required to attend this meeting. This meeting is open to any council members who wish to attend.

Council meetings are a key part of a Knight's experience. It is imperative that these meetings respect the valuable time of our members. Outdated, wasteful practices must be replaced by relevant, motivating meeting agendas that fully engage attendees.

The Fraternal Mission staff did an extensive review of council meetings including a survey with feedback from nearly 55,000 members. The outcome of this careful research is a new set of guidelines and agendas for council meetings that reflect what Knights want and need. Care should be taken, however, to preserve the intent and purpose of standard agenda items and to ensure meetings do not exceed one hour.

Are councils required to hold two meetings per month? Yes. Council meetings and Officer Planning meetings are both required each month.

Are we permitted to keep aspects of the former meeting structure that have been removed? A council may vote to retain aspects of the former meeting structure; however, careful consideration should be given to the value of these elements as well as the time involved. All meeting agenda items should be completed within one hour.

Can council votes be held at an Officers' Planning meeting? No. Council votes can only be held at Council Meetings.

Do the Treasurer and Financial Secretary both speak during the Financial Report of the Council meeting? In general, the Financial Report will cover only the status of council accounts managed by the Treasurer. The Financial Secretary may be asked to provide a report on other timely matters, or in response to a question from the members.

What is included in the Financial Report? The Financial Report should be limited to a status of the council's bank accounts, including aggregate receipts and expenditures, funds raised from events, and charitable contributions by the council. It should assure members that adequate funds are available for upcoming commitments.

Does the Financial Secretary report on council standing, dues collection, etc. only at the Officers' Planning Meeting? The Financial Secretary provides a complete and full report at the Officers' Planning meeting. Members interested in the details of council finances should attend the Officers' Planning meeting where more in depth financial discussions take place.

When and at which meeting should a member raise a new topic or issue? A member should notify the Grand Knight, prior to any meeting, of a new topic or issue he would like to raise. This allows the Grand Knight time to add the item to an upcoming meeting agenda. Suggestions and new topics should be addressed at the Officers' Planning meeting. However, time sensitive or emergency issues may be raised during the New Business portion of a Council meeting.

Why was the council chamber setup modified? The prior setup facilitated exemplification ceremonies during the meetings themselves. Now that 'Initiations' are no longer part of the meeting agenda; the modified chamber setup is more appropriate. The officers and directors who will be giving most of the presentations are all seated in front of the members. The members are all facing the front of the room where the speakers will be giving their remarks.

One of the most effective ways in which the Knights of Columbus has helped thousands of women save their children is through its <u>Ultrasound Initiative</u>.

Ultrasound exams, which are medically necessary throughout pregnancy for a variety of diagnostic reasons, use ultrasound waves to scan a woman's abdomen, creating a picture or "sonogram" of the baby in her uterus. Without K of C support, most pregnancy care centers would be unable to purchase the ultrasound machines, each usually costing tens of thousands of dollars.

Providing ultrasound machines to pregnancy resource centers has enabled many thousands of pregnant women to see that their unborn child is a living human being. Ultrasound technology allows a mother to see her developing child and recognize the miracle of life within her. As a result, thousands of mothers have decided to have their babies.

The Supreme Council shares the cost of ultrasound machines with state and local councils. Since the Knights of Columbus <u>Ultrasound Initiative</u> launched Jan. 22, 2009 on the 36th anniversary of *Roe v*. *Wade*, the Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion in the United States, state and local councils have assisted qualified pregnancy centers by raising half the cost of ultrasound machines.

THE THREE LEGS TO VICTORY OF THE PRO-LIFE STOOL
