With that said, I'd like to extend an invitation to each one of you to please join us on Saturday, April 18, 2015, for our semi-annual KC #4204 **COIN DROP**. The next one will be in early October 2015.

For those of you who may be new, this is where we collect money at the corner of 99 and 90 for KC State Charities. We need a lot of brothers on that particular day.......the more we get to turn out and help.....the more we collect......it's that \$imple. Wives are also welcome and I hope that you can join us on Saturday the 18<sup>th</sup> of April. We typically ask for brothers to pick one of three two hour time stints. Hopefully you can help us from 8:00 to 10:00 or 10:00 to 12:00 or 12:00 to 2:00. Some of you have helped for more than the two hours and that's GREAT! "GIVE THE GIFT OF LIFE", by Paul V. Cinquemani, Blood Drive Chairperson, 832-594-6753-direct

Our first 2015 KC 4204 Blood Drive is fast approaching us on Sunday, April 19, 2015, the day after coin drop!! As Catholics, we are called by Jesus to give spiritually in love.. What a way to put an exclamation point on your giving, by literally physically giving of "yourself" to save lives!!? Actually for every pint of blood you donate, you save 3 lives on average! This year we will be doing something a bit different. We will actually have 3 blood drives, not 4.. We have coordinated with other blood drives in the area so that we are not overlapping drives, or otherwise competing with other drives and adversely impacting our turnout numbers. So by doing that, we hope to INCREASE our overall count of donors PER DRIVE.. But hold on.. There is more....

Going a step further, please consider and put the word out about doing "double red" donations. We want to focus on double red this year. Simply put,, it is a WIN- WIN for everyone.. Gulf Coast gets a higher yield of blood and ready to use blood, all while the donor has equal ease of donating! The machine "returns" your non-red cell fluids back to your body to assist in keeping you hydrated and maintaining your energy to the end of your donation and beyond! I personally notice NO difference in my energy level between a single donation and a double red donation. BUT, I am actually giving OVER double the donation in final yield. A pint of whole blood actually has to be filtered and processed, thereby yielding LESS than a pint of blood in the end, not counting cost of processing it..

**Our hopes this 2015 year:** Double our units per donor, and drastically INCREASE our overall units donated. It's just more efficient for the donor and GC.

E.g., if I donate single whole blood in 4 drives, that is 4 units per year. If I donate double red in 3 drives, that is 6 units per year. And if we get overall higher donor turnout, combined with double red, that should significantly increase our units gathered. Currently we are averaging about 100 units per year, for about 85-90 donors. But if we get 120 donors for the year at 2 units per donor, that is 240 units per year! If one does the math is makes more sense for everyone. And note that the drives will be scheduled in such a way that each donor, if they are ready to go on April 19, WILL be able to get in 3 drives this year at St. Theresa drives. Each donor is allowed to donate after 16 WEEKS from the double red donation date. But it also encourages donors to RETURN to St. Theresa because our schedule fits theirs.

Roll up sleeves, drop your arms down, and come on out!! We look forward to seeing you and/or your families!! SAVE THE DATES for our drives: April 19; 08/16; 12/13/2015

- 3. The applicant's <u>NAME SHOULD APPEAR ONLY ON THE COVER SHEET</u> and there shall be no reference to your name or the names of any members of your family in your essay, <u>or you will be disqualified.</u>
